For decades Naturestages, TAC's environmental arts initiative has created participatory programs for classes, families, and outdoor venues that focus on local walks, trips, and roadside venues. Themes combine science (geology, botany, and habitat) with indigenous myths, human history, with the arts they sourced (poetry, plays, songs, dances and paintings).

Depending on the age of your group (Grades 3-12) and your chosen area of focus (i.e. human history, plants and wildlife, climate change, or revisioning the past, the creative team at The Acting Center will build a program for your group. Karen De Mauro has directed award-winning programs for Acadia National Parks, The Smithsonian, and North Shore Land Alliance, NYC Urban Sketchers, The Walt Whitman Birthplace and National History Day, and leads dozens of workshops every year.
